



## Frequently Asked Questions:

1. Q. Why has there been such a large price increase in tournament fees?  
A. A significant number of golf courses are no longer able to provide free golf for our Pikes Peak Junior Golf program.
  1. Of the \$20.00 fee for 18-hole tournaments, \$5.00 goes to PPJG for trophies, and \$15.00 goes to the golf course to cover the discounted greens fees.
  2. Of the \$10.00 fee for 9-hole tournaments, \$5.00 goes to PPJG for trophies and \$5.00 goes to the golf course to cover the discounted greens fees.
  
2. Q. Is there a dress code?  
A. Yes, all PPJG participants must wear appropriate golf attire:  
Collared shirt or Mock turtleneck NO T-SHIRTS, TANK TOPS  
Slacks or shorts - NO DENIM, GYM TRUNKS, SWEATPANTS OR SHORT SHORTS  
Soft spikes or tennis shoes
  
3. Q. What ages can play?  
A. There are two divisions in Pikes Peak Junior Golf (PPJG):
  - 1) Boys and Girls, Ages 10-13——9-Hole Events
  - 2) Boys and Girls, Ages 14-18——18-Hole Events
  
4. Q. How do we sign up?  
A. **9-hole players (ages 10-13)** can print an entry form from the PPJG web site. The entry form must be completed and returned with payment as soon as possible;  
*THESE FIELDS ARE LIMITED*  
**18-hole players: (ages 14-18)** These tournaments are team events.  
Males golfers must sign up through, and in some cases, compete for, a tournament spot, through the golf course of the players' choice. Players can compete as individuals if their golf course does not have enough players to field a full team. *In any case, players (both team and individuals) are entered in the tournament by their golf course. Fees will be paid at check-in.*  
Female players can either sign up through the participating golf course of their choice OR complete and return with payment an entry form available through the PPJG website. Enter as early as possible:

5. Q. What if my child is younger than 10?  
A. You must get the approval of one of the area golf professionals who in turn must verify your child's ability to the PPJG director. No players under the age of 10 can play at Valley Hi or Patty Jewett, regardless.
  
6. Q. What are the times of the tournaments?  
A. Check in is to be completed by 7:00 AM, which means you should get to the course no later than 6:50 AM. All tournaments are shotgun start.

7. Q. Can parents accompany their children during the tournaments?  
A. Yes, with exceptions.  
**“Niners” parents** are needed to keep score for each group, however, there is no caddying, coaching or other types of advice allowed. Parents who violate the caddying rule (or appear to violate this rule) will be asked to return to the clubhouse. Parents are allowed to search for lost balls or act as forecaddy for the group. Good shots are to be cheered!  
**Parents or any other fan of 18-hole participants** are not allowed to caddy, coach, offer critiques of club selection, or react negatively to any shot during tournament play. It is the parent or fans responsibility to avoid the appearance of caddying, coaching, or offering advice. Parents who violate this rule, OR APPEAR TO BE violating this rule, will be asked to return to the clubhouse. Parents are allowed to search for lost balls or act as forecaddy for the group. Good shots are to be cheered!
8. Q. Are carts allowed?  
A. All players must carry their bag or use a pull cart. Parents may rent a cart, depending on the golf course in question. Carts must stay on cart path at all times. Players are not to ride on golf carts. Exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Tournament Director in advance.
9. Q. Are GPS or range-finding devices allowed during PPJG competitions?
